### JOHN SUMMONS ACCEPTS DUAL ROLE

VHP is proud and excited to announce that Australian playwright, **John Summons** (*pictured right*), is Patron of VHP's inaugural Playwrights' Competition and also one of its judges.

Many of you who have attended VHP performances will have seen one or more of John's plays. Our first production in 2010 included his very funny comedy *Law of the Jungle*, while our first public production in 2011 was of his wonderful play *Grand Tour*. In addition, *Shadow Boy* was the play the DIRT programme used to workshop in its first semester and VHP has included *Two in a Room* in its 2013 winter production, *Light & Dark*.

VHP Artistic Director, Lynette Zito, said, "I am an admirer of John's plays which are universal in theme while being very Australian in language. I contacted him in hope but didn't really expect him to accept one, much less both, roles!"

In response to VHP's invitation, John wrote, "I would be honoured to be Patron and a judge."

John has been writing stories and plays for adults and children for over thirty years. The Coroner's Report was his first professionally produced play, presented by the Nimrod Theatre in 1977. Other plays John has written for adults include Massacre at Myall Creek and Lamb of God. Plays for children include Kamikaze Kate and the Sword of Captain Kuroda, Adventure at Whaler's Bay, Rats! and A Rat's Tale.

He was playwright-in-residence at Sydney's Ensemble Theatre and has had plays produced by a Sydney's number of leading theatres. John has been a high school teacher of English, ESL. history and drama and a lecturer in for playwrights at course Sydney's Institute of Technology. His publishers include Cambridge University Press (UK), The Publishing Company Dramatic



(USA) and Currency Press (Australia) and he is a member of the Australian Writers' Guild.

"I believe VHP can learn a lot from our association with such a respected playwright as John Summons and I hope John will gain something from it as well," said Lynette, "even if it is only the thanks of the Players and the participants in the competition for his involvement."

## **Upcoming Productions**

**Laugh Your Dreams Away** is our first touring production for 2013 and is produced by Veronica Cooling.

Two one act plays make up the show which runs for approximately two hours including interval.

Farmer Will Swap Combine Harvester for Wife, by Australian author Hugh O'Brien, is the hilarious but very touching story of a man who needs an heir so that he can pass on the family farm.

Can You Hear the Music? by British author David Campton looks at the dreams of six individual mice living in a loft. Their dreams are conjured up by music, as each one hears and must respond to a different tune played by the invisible Piper.

Light & Dark combines three, short one act plays, with a thought provoking drama sandwiched between two comedies. Produced by Lynette Zito, the theme of the production is the power of language and each play illustrates a different aspect of this central theme.

He Said and She Said is a comedy with a sting by American playwright Alice Gerstenberg. Set in the home of wealthy socialites, Mrs Packard, a dinner guest and gossip, causes havoc before dinner is even served!

Two in a Room, a drama by John Summons, deals with a bizarre encounter between two people – he's trying to buy love and she is simply selling sex.

Call Girls, by British playwright David Muncaster, is a very funny comedy set in an IT call centre where four women work. Laura, the new girl on the team, has raised the ire of her three co-workers with her low cut tops, short skirts and her unwillingness to be one of the team. The others speculate on the relationship between Laura and Gary, the boss. What are his intentions?

### **DIRT**

DIRT (Drama In a Rural Town), the VHP youth theatre program, has two new instructors in 2013 - Veronica Cooling and Rick Broomhead. In the late 1980's, Veronica and Rick, together with Susan Thiselton, founded the Music And Drama Society (MADS) under the auspice of the Kyogle and District Arts Council. MADS' held acting workshops for both adults and children and a number of performances were produced.

The MADS Kids took part in the annual Fairymount Festivals for a few years. As many of you will remember, each year the Festival had a different theme, and MADS members young and old would come to town dressed to the theme and would perform in the street and also in the concert program. The first year's performance in the Festival concert was a song and dance presentation by the MADS Kids of three songs from the musical *Oliver!* Another year, the adult members of MADS joined with the kids to perform three traditional fairy tales.

Acting workshops were directed by Veronica and Rick directed the rehearsals of the kids' performances.


You need not even read. We have members who like to come along and simply listen.
