#### **Kyogle Labyrinth**

Did you know that Kyogle has a Labyrinth? It's located in Alcorn Park near the caravan park/ tennis courts and was constructed by Kyogle Council and the community.



The labyrinth came about from Harmony Walsh's idea which was voted the People's Choice at the Bright Ideas night in 2016.

The surface comprises a turfed path, suitable for wheelchairs and people with restricted mobility, lined with pavers. The pavers sit flush with the surface and are laser etched with designs, wording and names created by community members.

VHP proudly purchased two pavers (see photos below) which now form a part of this wonderful project.
