## KMI HALL STAGE UPGRADE

Village Hall Players is applying for a grant to upgrade the stage at the KMI Hall. We are working with Kyogle Council but we need your feedback, please. Our goal is to bring the KMI stage equipment into the 21<sup>st</sup> century to provide better quality productions for everyone who performs on the stage.

To do that, we need electric curtain operation for all three curtains on the stage – the black backdrop, the scrim and the front curtain. At the moment, these curtains require someone to pull on ropes to open and close them (very modern!). As our DIRT students are sometimes the ones who need to do this, this is important for them as well.

Next on our wish list is a lighting upgrade. A back lighting bar is needed. This is an important part of stage lighting as it helps separate the subject and the background. It can also give a more three-dimensional appearance to actors and set elements and is helpful when using the scrim. We also need new lighting cans on the two front lighting bars as the current ones are not compatible with contemporary fixtures, such as barn doors.

Then there are issues with the curtains – the new blue front curtain is too short, as is the scrim, and the black curtain needs to be moved further downstage to get the best use from it and to allow crew and cast to more easily move behind the scenes. The scrim can be used in multiple ways. One is as a projection screen for performances or movies or training, etc. For that, there needs to be a projector fit for purpose, so we're adding that to the wish list.

And finally, there needs to be sound insulation installed below the roof over the stage so that when it rains, audience members and performers alike can hear what's going on.
